Explanations

1. We use “this” for one thing that is close to us. “These” is for many things that are close. “Those” is for many things that are far. The sentence talks about one book.
2. We use “those” for many things that are far away. “Those” shows more than one item and not close to us. It is the correct word for this situation.
3. We use “those” for more than one thing that is far from us. “Shoes” means two or more, and the question asks about shoes that are not close, so we say “those.”
4. “Those” means more than one thing (plural) and far away from you. “That” is for one thing far away. “These” is for things close to you.
5. “This,” “these” are words that show which thing or things we talk about. “Happy” is not. “Happy” is a feeling, not a word for things.
6. We use “these” for many things or people that are close to us. “These” means more than one and shows they are near. “This” is for one, “those” for far away.
7. We use "that" for one thing, not very close to us. "That is my book" shows the book is one object, a little far away from the speaker.
8. We use “these” for more than one thing that is close to us. The apples are near and there are many, so “these” is the right word for the sentence.
9. “House” is different because it is a thing, or noun. “This,” “that,” and “those” are words we use to talk about things and show where they are.

10. We use "this" for one thing that is close to us. "This" is for something near. It helps us talk about one object we can touch or see very close.

11. We use "this" for one thing close to us. "This is my toy car" is correct because there is only one car, and it is near the speaker.

12. We use "those" to talk about more than one thing (plural) that is far from us. "Books" means many, and they are not close, so "those" is correct here.

13. We use "this" for one thing that is close to us. The chair is near you and there is only one, so "this" is the right word in the sentence.

14. We use "these" for more than one thing that is close to us. "Pens" means many, and they are here, so "these" is the right word.

15. We use "these" for many things near us. "This" is for one thing near us, but "these" is for more than one. "Those" is for many things far away.

16. We use "this" for one thing that is close to us. Here, there is one flower, and we are looking at it nearby, so "this" is the correct word to use.

17. "This" is for just one thing close to you. It means one. "These" and "those" are for more than one. "These" is for things near, "those" for things far.

18. We use "these" for two or more things close to us. Shoes are a pair, so we say "these are my shoes." "This" and "that" are for one thing only.

19. We use "this" for one thing that is near us. "This" means close. "That" is for far things, and "those" is for more than one thing. "This" is the correct choice here.
